

# Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce

Location: 36 King Street, Brussels, Ontario  
Year built: 1938

THE STANDARD BANK OF CANADA was located at the end of the block on the east side of Turnberry Street. The Standard Bank amalgamated with The Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce in the 1930s. The bank moved to the corner of Turnberry and Thomas Streets where the Bank of Nova Scotia was originally. The former Standard Bank building housed a dairy bar, a jewellery store, and a used furniture store.

In 1986, a new EMA grocery store opened on the corner of King and Turnberry streets on the site of the former Queen's Hotel. In 1993, the building was expanded and joined by a common lobby to the new branch location of the CIBC complete with a 24-hour instant-teller banking machine.
