Starting Friday **September 2nd** the Automated Collection Truck will begin collecting the "Wheelie" Bins in the rest of Huron East. Using the bins is as easy as **1-2-3!**

1 Collect.

Collect all your materials inside your home!
TIP: Gather your recyclable materials using your blue box. Find out acceptable materials on the lid of the bin or with the image search feature in our RecycleCoach App. Use small kitchen catcher type bags around the house to capture waste where ever it is generated.



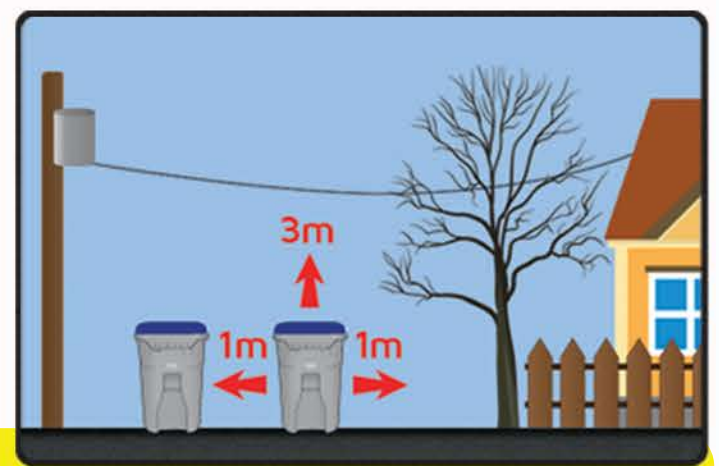
2 Empty.

Empty the blue box contents into the Blue recycling bin. Place your kitchen catcher bags directly in the Black waste bin.
TIP: Place all the recyclable items loose in the bin. Do not bag or tie anything to help us separate better with the exception of plastic bags and shredded paper which should be bagged in a clear bag before being placed in the recycling bin. Trash may be bagged if you wish.



3 Set Out.

Set out your "wheelie" bins at the road when full (or almost full)
TIP: The "wheelie" bins should be placed at least **3 feet away from any other objects** with the wheels and handle pointing towards the house and the lid opening towards the road. The truck arm can reach up to 12 feet. Do not place the bin where it might interfere with pedestrian traffic on sidewalks or vehicular traffic on the road.



Collection Changes

Schedule: Starting in September all waste and recycling collection will be done on a biweekly basis. The Tuckersmith rural will be moved to Wednesday and the Vanastra area will remain on Friday but it will change week to accomodate the change in service.

Holidays: Collection will occur even on holidays except Christmas and New Year's day where an alternate date will be set, usually on the Saturday.

User Pay: You will no longer need to buy tags for waste collection as waste collection is now part of your residential taxation (farmland is not taxed for this service). Until the end of October, refunds for unused bag tags can be obtained from the Municipal Office.

Hazardous Waste

The County of Huron operates a Household Hazardous Waste depot at the Mid-Huron Transfer Site. Contact the County of Huron at 519-482-7668 for more information. The Mid Huron Transfer Site is located at 37506 A Huron Road (Highway 8) near Holmesville (open Tuesdays to Saturdays 8 am to 12:30 pm).

- Batteries (household, rechargeable, automotive)
- Household cleaners, such as bleach & oven cleaner
- Energy efficient bulbs, fluorescent tubes/bulbs
- Hair dye, nail polish, nail polish remover
- Paints, varnish, solvents,
- Caulking, glue
- Fuels, antifreeze,
- Brake fluid
- Used motor oil



Electronic Waste

Bring all of your E-Waste free of charge to the e-waste bin at the Mid-Huron Transfer site or the Walton Landfill site. Refer to the municipal web site for more information. Here is a list of acceptable recyclable electronic waste.

Commercial and Multi-Residential Sites

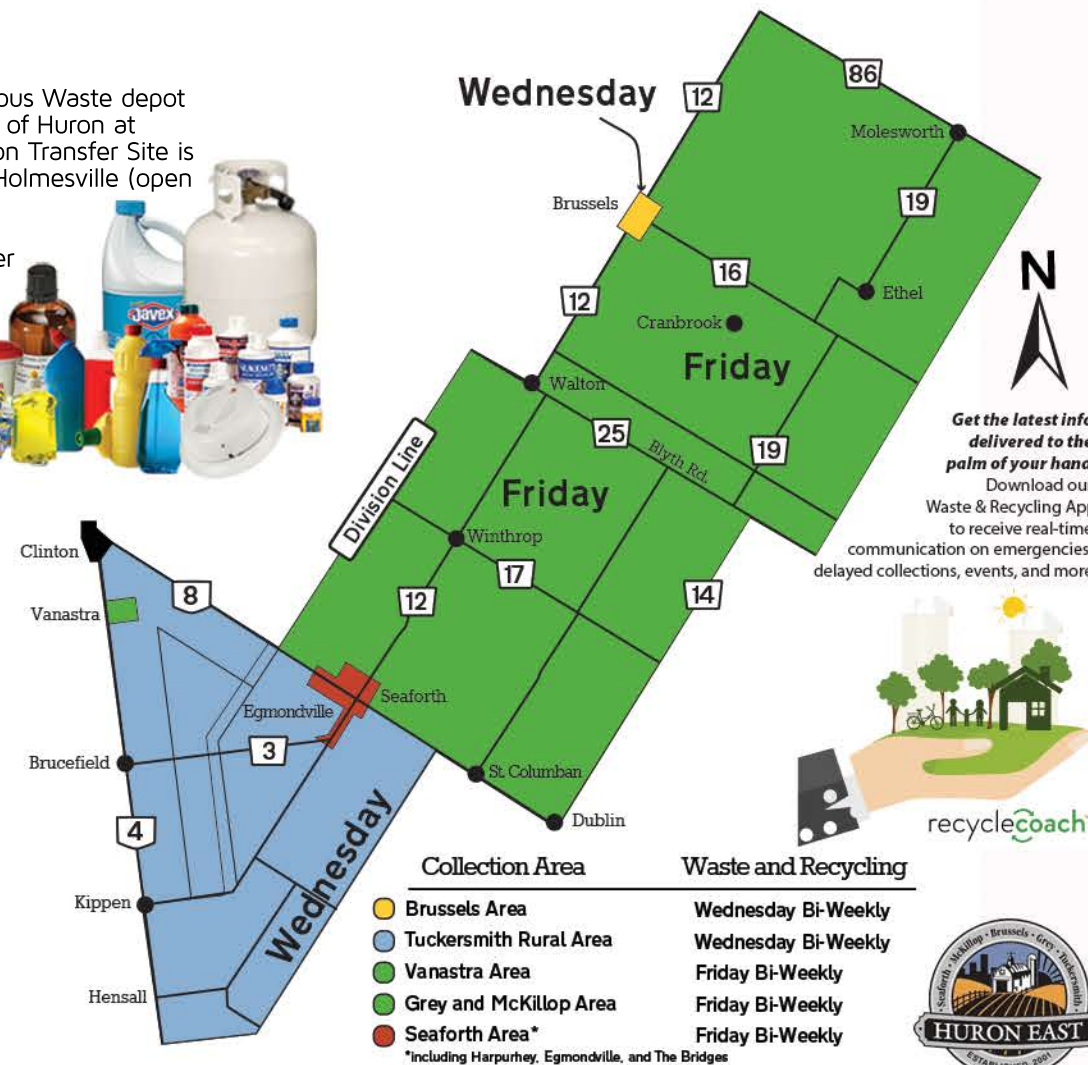
Stand alone commercial properties, and multi-residential sites such as apartment, or condo complexes, are not automatically included in the municipal collection system.

Which Side of the Street To Setout Your Bin?

Areas already serviced by the Association will remain unchanged, collected where the current recycling bin is placed.

The Tuckersmith rural area will be collected on one side only where collection occurs currently, or where driver leaves the bin(s).

Brussels will be collected on both sides except the following areas:
Elm St. from West of Stretton to be put out on South side of Road
King St. from West of Mary to be put out on South side of Road
Jackson St. to be put out on South side of road
Fishleigh St. from Jackson on the west side of the road
Frederick St. South side of the road
Krauter Ct. North side of the road
Maple St. from Ellen Street east side of the road
McCutcheon Dr. from east of Sports Drive North side of road
