The past year and a half has been challenging for everyone in our community due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We are beginning to see the light at the end of the tunnel with the rollout of vaccines and our Huron-Perth community achieving the 70% fully vaccinated threshold. As we approach this fall, it is important to encourage those who have not been vaccinated and those still needing their second dose to attend one of the convenient walk-in clinics being scheduled throughout Huron County. The sooner we reach greater thresholds, the sooner we can move past this pandemic. On the brighter side, it is great to see our businesses open and our community active. Recently, I was heading to an evening meeting and was so pleased to see a youth baseball game in action.



Construction in Seaforth is finally coming to an end, with new streetscapes along our Main Street and Goderich Street East. The downtown areas look great. We are also pleased to be replacing

the Green Bridge at the intersection of Front Road and Kinburn Line. We thank our federal and provincial partners for the funding to undertake these large, well needed, construction projects.

I am excited to see the renovation of the Brussels, Morris & Grey Community Centre moving forward thanks to funding from the federal and provincial governments through an Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) Community Culture and Recreation (CCR) Funding Stream, with \$1,915,200 federal and \$1,595,840 provincial contributions. The renovation will include new dressing rooms, new lobby with heated viewing area, and a fitness centre.

Huron East has been experiencing increased growth in housing with new developments occurring throughout the Municipality, including a new subdivision being developed by the Municipality in Brussels in the very near future. With the current housing shortage, we anticipate seeing continued demand in the residential housing market and Huron East is well positioned for this new growth.

All these exciting projects and developments demonstrate that the Municipality of Huron East is a vibrant community.

2020 BudgetCouncil adopted a 2021 budget with total expenditures of \$18.6 million including \$8.1 million in capital expenditures. Major capital expenditures include Replacement of the Bridge Structure T13 at Front Road and Kinburn Line (\$2,564,100), Brussels Wastewater filtration building upgrades (\$2,200,000), Phase 1 of the Connecting Link-Hwy 8 Reconstruction (Sidewalks/Wastewater - \$947,641), Completion of Phase 2 reconstruction (Water/Wastewater/Storm/Sidewalk/Streetlights) of Main Street - County Rd 12 in Seaforth (\$715,900), Replacement of the 1986 Tanker Truck at the Grey Fire Station (\$500,000), Repaving of Morrison Line from Kippen Road to Mill Road (\$448,000), and Water/ Wastewater SCADA system upgrades (\$155,000).

The Huron East Municipal portion of the tax levy has increased by 5.71%. Of the total \$17.1 million tax levy in Huron East, \$7.8 million remains with Huron East, \$6.6 million allocated to the County of Huron and \$2.7 million allocated for educational purposes. Property increases per ward vary because of area rated services but will generally range from an increase of 0.97% in the McKillop Ward to an increase of 6.59% in the Grey Ward. Individual properties may experience slightly different rates due to the changes in their assessment values. Please note 2021 was scheduled to be the 1st year of a new 4-year assessment phase-in cycle however due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, property reassessments have been postponed. Your 2021 and 2022 property assessments will remain at 2020 values unless there has been work completed on the property. Urban property owners serviced by water and sewer will note that their quarterly bills have remained at 2020 rates.

Town Hall is open to the public. For your safety and the safety of our staff the following precautions are in place:

- Appointments are encouraged if visiting someone in the office.
- Face masks are required to enter Town Hall as per Huron Perth Public Health and everyone is encouraged to use the hand sanitizer available.
- In order to maintain social distancing, only one person is allowed in the offices at this time so if someone is already in being assisted please kindly wait in the lobby (maintaining your social distance) until it is your turn.
- Frequently touched surfaces are disinfected on a regular basis throughout the day.

REUSE, REDUCE, RECYCLE!

Recycling & Garbage Collection has changed in Huron East. Please refer to the website for calendars, contacts, and details.

There are several large recycling depots in Huron East for those occasions when you have additional cardboard or when you've missed your regular pick up day. These bins are for recyclable materials only. If garbage is placed in them, the bins will be permanently removed.

LEAVES

<u>Mulch</u> your leaves this year and save time, energy and your back by not raking! All you need to do is run over the leaves with your lawnmower.

Compost - Take yard and garden waste to the Municipal Compost Sites at 79522 Hannah Line in Harpurhey and 108 Turnberry Street in Brussels, and place in the areas marked COMPOST. Do not leave bags, boxes, containers or garbage at the compost sites.

Rake your leaves into windrows at the curb to be collected by the Leaf Sucker beginning October 18, 2021 and ending November 12, 2021, on:

- Monday/Tuesday/Wednesday in Seaforth/Egmondville/Harpurhey
- Thursday/Friday in Brussels

<u>Bag</u> - Leaves in paper yard waste bags placed at the curb, will be collected in a timely manner. (Huron East does not provide bags.) Do not blow mulched leaves or grass onto sidewalks or road edges, this creates slippery surfaces for pedestrians, cyclists & drivers and is an offence (Section 180 Highway Traffic Act).

The leaf sucker is not able to pick up mulched leaves or grass. Debris on the road clogs our catchbasins, which leads to flooding after heavy rains.

Fall Pick Up in Vanastra - November 1 and 15 Brush clippings, leaves and garden refuse must be bundled, tied or in paper bags for pick up at curbside on these 2 dates.

Septic & Plumbing Permits

As of January 1, 2020, Huron East is the approval authority for septic and plumbing permits and inspections.

PUBLIC WORKS

Notice to owners with sump pumps

It is illegal to pump storm water from eave troughs or basement sump pumps into the sanitary sewer. Sump Pumps should discharge water directly onto the ground and away from neighbouring properties.

<u>Water Meters</u> - keep access to water meters free of obstructions (snow, closed gates, etc.) <u>Snow Removal & Parking on Streets:</u>

- No person shall deposit snow or ice on a roadway
- Parking is not permitted on any street or road between the hours of 2 am and 6 am from November 1 to April 15. Violators will be ticketed and may have their vehicles towed and impounded.
- It is ILLEGAL to park a heavy truck on ANY street in an urban area, any time of day/year. The fine is \$200.

Parking

The best parking spots downtown are actually NOT parking spots. Look for the Lines; Read the Signs. Please refer to Parking By-Law No. 5 - 2012 on the Huron East website to ensure you are obeying the law so you won't get a ticket.

There is plenty of parking for business owners, staff and tenants in municipal parking lots, private parking lots and on side streets.

<u>Municipal Road Safety</u>

A permit is required for new field entrances, laneways or driveways. The application and information is on our website.

The average rural road allowance is 66 feet.
