A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

What a difference a year makes. I reviewed our Spring 2020 newsletter, which was issued the first week of March with our tax bills, and there is no mention of COVID-19.

As we enter March of 2021, COVID-19 has now been with us for 12 months and we can be encouraged by declining numbers and the knowledge that vaccines are now starting to arrive and our Federal and Provincial governments are assuring us that distribution will increase in the coming weeks. As a Municipality that owns both the Huron East Health Centre and the Brussels Medical Dental Centre along with community centres in Seaforth, Brussels and Vanastra, we are making all our facilities and staff available to assist with vaccination programs if requested.



From a construction perspective, the Municipality is going to experience another busy year. In 2020, COVID-19 caused a delay in the commencement of the reconstruction of the Seaforth

Main Street and this project will be finalized early this Spring. The Municipality has received MTO connecting link funding and has tendered the reconstruction of Highway 8 in Seaforth from County Road 12 to the easterly edge of Seaforth. This project will likely commence in April. Other major projects include a bridge replacement at the intersection of Front Road/Kinburn Line and a new filtration/UV treatment building at the Brussels sewage treatment plant.

While we see positive signs in declining infections and the arrival of vaccines, now is not the time to let our guard down. Please continue to wear a mark, wash your hands and physically distance to stop the spread of COVID-19. Our community has been resilient and I would like to express Council's appreciation to all service clubs, charitable organizations and minor sports organizations for finding innovative means of providing services and programs. I am sure that 2021 will end on a higher note than it began.

2021 Budget

Council has commenced the 2021 budget process. Council will be reviewing different components of the budget during their regular meetings and members of the public are welcome to attend these meetings. A notice of the final budget meeting, anticipated on March 16th will be placed in local newspapers and a brief synopsis of the budget will be placed on the website prior to this meeting.

Property Taxation & Assessment

Tax notices are sent out twice a year; the interim bill in early March and the final bill in early September. Each bill contains two installment dates. The 2021 installment dates are as follows: March 31st, June 30th, September 30th and November 30th.

It is the responsibility of the property owner to ensure payment is received at the municipal office on or before these due dates to avoid penalty. If making payments by telephone or electronically, please allow for processing time as payments must be received in the municipal office on/or before the due date to avoid penalty charges.

Purchasing a Farm

When a farm is sold it will become 100% residential tax class. This can mean the difference of thousands of dollars on a tax notice. Please call AGRICORP at 1-888-247-4999 or email <u>contact@agricorp.com</u>, as soon as possible after the purchase of a farm, in order to get the property in the correct tax class.

Assessment Value Appeals

For all property assessment concerns, please contact MPAC (Municipal Property Assessment Corporation) at 1-866-296-6722 or go to your property at <u>www.aboutmyproperty.ca</u>. Have your property roll number available to assist with your inquiry. If you wish to appeal your 2021 property assessment the deadline is 90 days after the date of MPAC's Assessment Notice. Request for Reconsideration forms are available at the Municipal office in Seaforth, at <u>www.huroneast.com</u> or <u>www.mpac.ca</u>.

Mailing Address

Please notify the tax department if your mailing address is incorrect or has changed. Failure to receive a tax notice does not exempt you from penalty.

E-Billing

If you would like to receive your Water/Sewer, Tax or Account Receivable bills from Huron East via email, please download the application form from <u>www.huroneast.com</u>, come into the municipal office or contact the property tax clerk, utility clerk or accounts payable clerk at 519-527-0160 for assistance.

Pre-Authorized Payment Plans

One of the easiest ways to pay your property taxes and utility bills is through a pre-authorized payment plan. Both taxes and utilities can be set up to be deducted from your bank account on the due dates. Property taxes can also be set up as a monthly deduction.

To enrol in a pre-authorized program your account(s) must be current. Please download the application form <u>www.huroneast.com</u>; come into the municipal office or contact the property tax clerk (ext. 22) or utility clerk (ext. 23) at 519-527-0160.

Septic & Plumbing Permits

As of January 1, 2020, Huron East is the approval authority for septic and plumbing permits and inspections.

PUBLIC WORKS

Municipal Road Safety

For safety and to ensure proper drainage, municipal road allowances are not to be planted with crops. Every property should have a defined legal entrance. The grass ditch area between the fence line and road should not be used as headlands.

A permit is required for new field entrances, laneways or driveways. The application and information is on our website.

The average rural road allowance is 66 feet. Watering Restrictions (By-Law 34-2006)

Outdoor watering - even numbered houses on even days and odd numbered houses on odd days from 7:00-9:00 morning/evening. Grass Mowing

Do not blow grass onto the roadway.

In urban areas, it collects in catch basins and leads to possible flooding. It creates a hazard for bike and motorcycle operators and is an offence (Section 180 Highway Traffic

As per the 2015 Ontario Fire Code, Section 2.4.4.4. (1) Open air burning shall not take place unless

(a) It has been *approved*, or

(b) The open air burning consists of a small, confined fire that is

(i) Used to cook food on a grill, barbecue or spit,

- (ii) Commensurate with the type and
- quantity of food being cooked, and
- (iii) Supervised at all times.
