Up-date for Week of September 27th, 2020

Paving the Way for a Better Seaforth

Construction Update for this Week:

- Prepare and pour concrete curbs from Market Street to Hwy 8 and Station Road to Railway Street West. (Work is to continue this week weather dependant.)
- Prepare and pour concrete sidewalks from Station Road towards Hwy 8. (This work will take approximately 2 more weeks weather dependant.)
- Continue to switch street lighting from the old poles to the new poles between Station Road and Market Street
- Install water service to Seaforth Plumbing and Heating (*Traffic control will be required on Hwy 8* to allow for this work so please watch for the flag people around the area of work.)
- Install railings on ramps into Town Hall.

Construction Time Lines for September & October 2020


- Installation of concrete curbs & sidewalks to continue for approximately 2 more weeks.
- Asphalt paving to begin mid-to-late October.
- The earliest date Main Street is expected to be *RE-OPEN* is October 23rd. *All dates are subject to change due to weather or any other unforeseen circumstances.*

FOODLAND PARKING LOT ACCESS

Entrance into the Foodland parking lot will continue by way of George Street (Seaforth Library).

Access to S. J. Fritzley Auto Repair, Everspring Farms, Janet's Cafe, Seaforth Car Wash and Rona Seaforth will also remain the same.

Watch for the yellow and black detour signs along Jarvis, Railway, Sills & Brantford Streets and Kippen Road to guide you.

Watch for the **YELLOW & BLACK** directional parking signs, and the round green universal signs marked with a "**P**" to guide you. Some side street parking is also available. A **NEW PARKING LOT** is *also open* immediately east of Seaforth Plumbing & Heating at the corner of Goderich & Victoria Streets. We encourage you to use it.
