Most exterior signage requires a permit before installation.

This includes:

- Freestanding signs
- Fascia signs
- Roof signs
- Perpendicular (projecting) signs

Obtaining the proper permit ensures your signage complies with municipal by-laws and helps maintain a cohesive and attractive downtown streetscape.

Downtown Business Information

Welcome to downtown Brussels or Seaforth! Below is important information to help you operate smoothly and support a vibrant, customer-friendly downtown.

Downtown Flowers and Street Furniture

Downtown beautification is supported through strong local partnerships.

In Seaforth, flowers, streetlight banners and much of the street furniture — including benches, picnic tables, planters, and waste receptacles — are purchased and maintained by the Seaforth Business Improvement Area (BIA).

In Brussels, downtown flower displays are proudly maintained by the Brussels Horticultural Society. Street furniture are purchased and maintained by the Municipality of Huron East in partnership with community groups.

These efforts help create welcoming, vibrant main streets for businesses, residents, and visitors alike.

Downtown Parking

To keep Main Street convenient and accessible for customers, business owners and employees are encouraged to park in municipal parking lots or designated off-street spaces whenever possible.

Municipal parking lots are located on:

- John Street, Seaforth
- Victoria Street, Seaforth
- 373 Turnberry St, Brussels
- 589 Turnberry St, Brussels

By keeping prime Main Street spaces open, we create a more welcoming and accessible shopping experience for visitors.

Heritage Buildings

Both downtown Brussels and Seaforth include designated heritage properties.

- A full list of designated properties can be found in the [Huron East Official Plan](#).
- Downtown Seaforth is a designated Heritage Conservation District, meaning most buildings in the downtown core are protected to preserve their historical character and architectural features.

If you own or lease a heritage property and plan to:

- Alter your building façade
- Replace windows or doors
- Change exterior materials
- Modify architectural features

You must submit an application to the Huron East Heritage Committee for approval before beginning work. For more information or to submit an application, visit: huroneast.com/heritage.

Early consultation is encouraged to help avoid project delays.

Sidewalk Cafes and Patios

Planning to operate a sidewalk café or patio? A municipal license is required.

Applications are submitted through the Clerk's Office: clerk@huroneast.com. Be sure to apply well in advance of your intended opening date to allow time for review and approval. The Sidewalk Cafes and Patios By-Law can be found at: huroneast.com/by-laws.

Seaforth Business Improvement Area

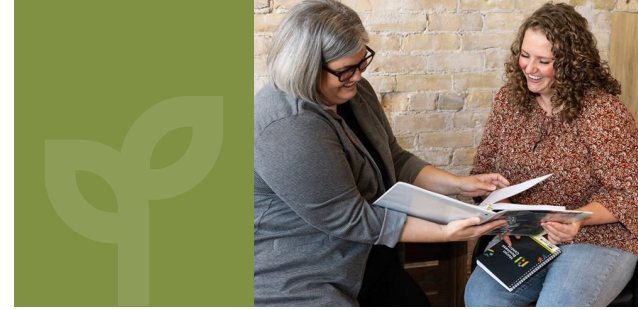
The Seaforth Business Improvement Area (BIA) is a non-profit organization established in 1981 to support, promote, and strengthen downtown Seaforth as a vibrant place to do business. If your business is located within the designated downtown area, you are part of a collective effort focused on attracting customers, improving the streetscape, and creating a thriving local economy.

The BIA works on behalf of its members through:

- Marketing and promotion of downtown Seaforth as a shopping and business destination
- Business recruitment and support
- Streetscape improvements and beautification projects
- Seasonal decorations
- Community events and initiatives that bring people downtown

Located primarily in historic downtown Seaforth — a designated heritage conservation district — the BIA is led by a volunteer Board of Directors made up of local business owners, property owners, a community member, and a representative from Huron East Council.

The BIA is funded through a levy collected from property owners within the designated area, along with fees from associate members located outside the boundary. These funds are reinvested directly into initiatives that benefit downtown businesses and the broader community, helping create a welcoming, active, and prosperous downtown.
